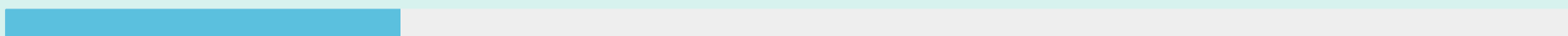

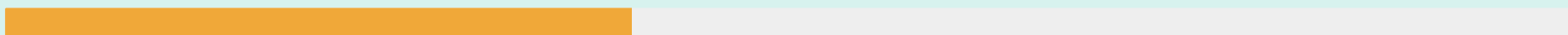

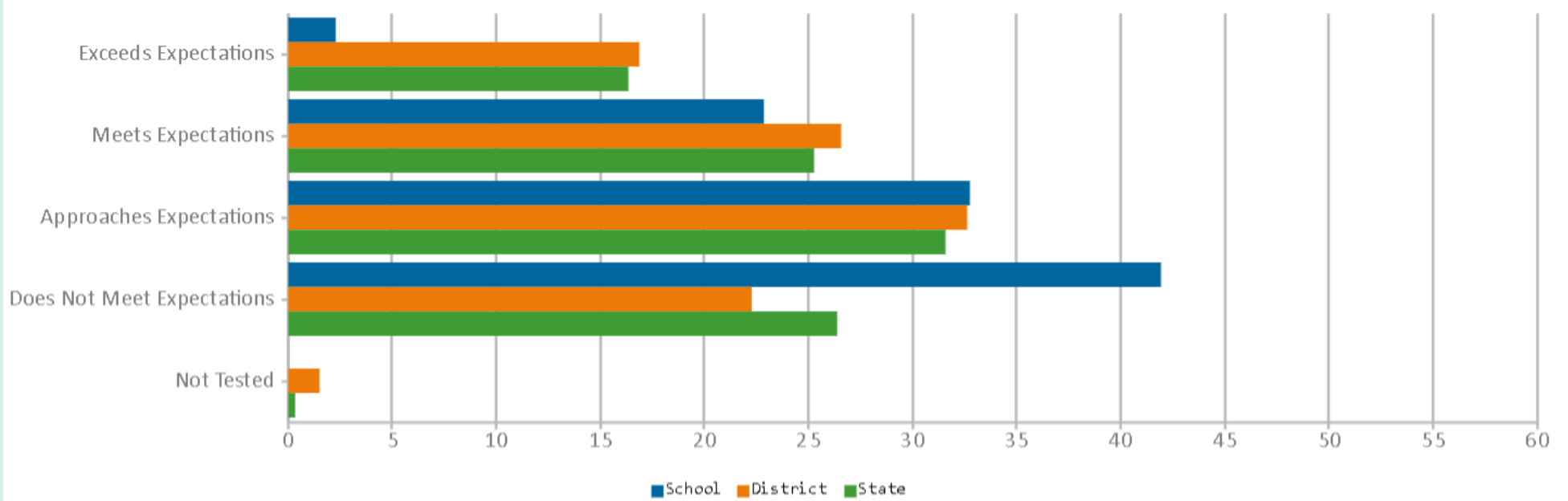

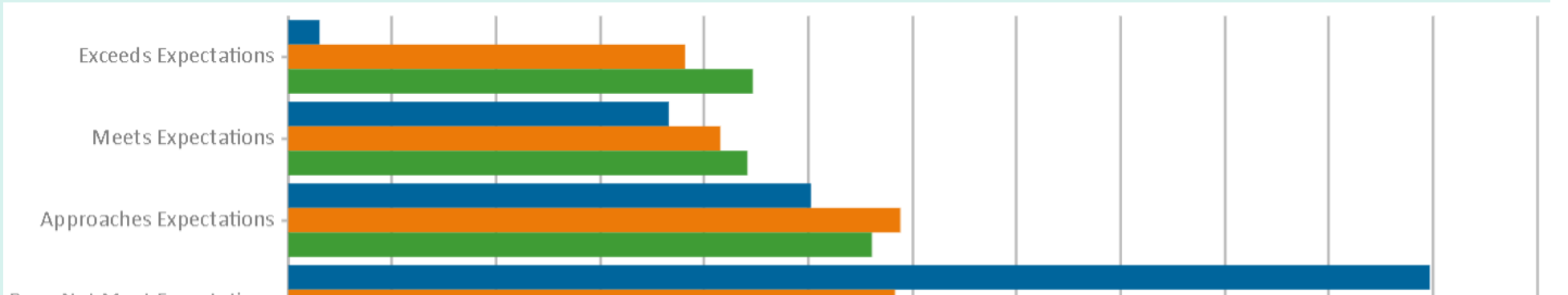

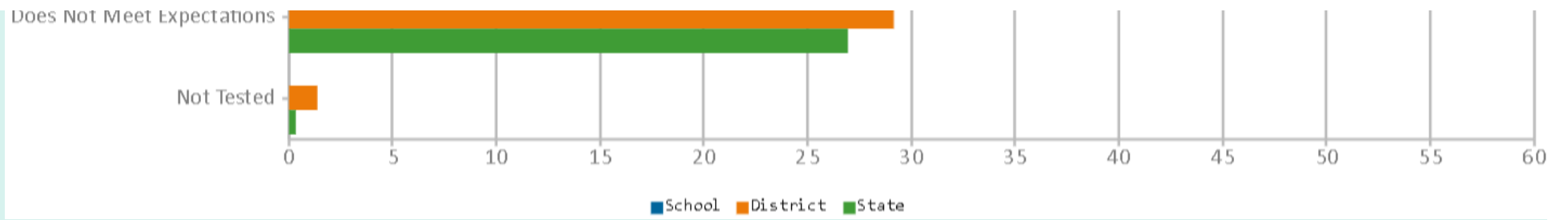
English Language Arts (Reading and Writing)

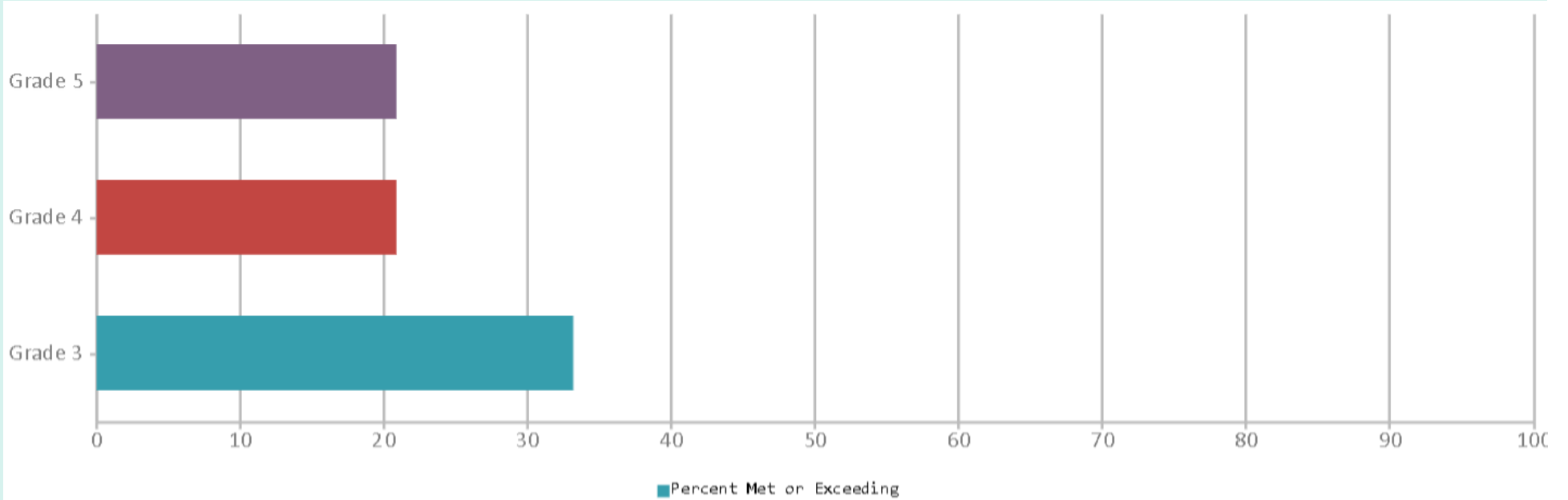

SC READY Performance by Grade Level

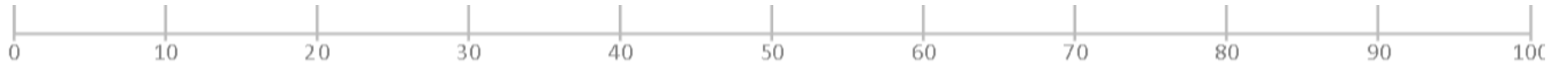

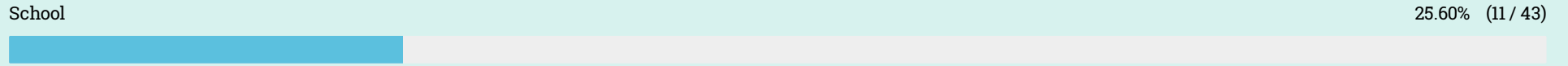

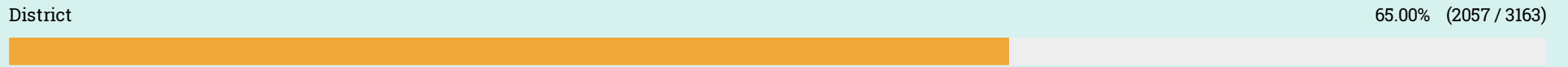

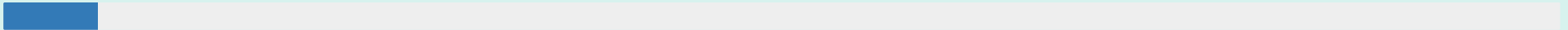
Percentage of students Approaching Readiness on the KRA

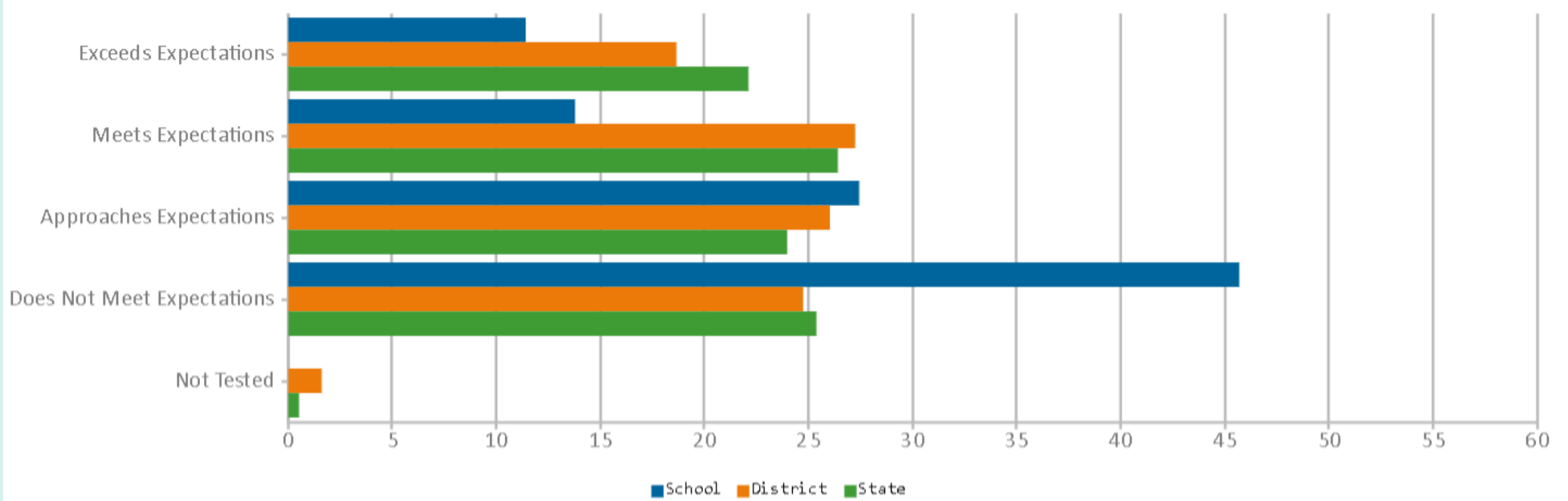

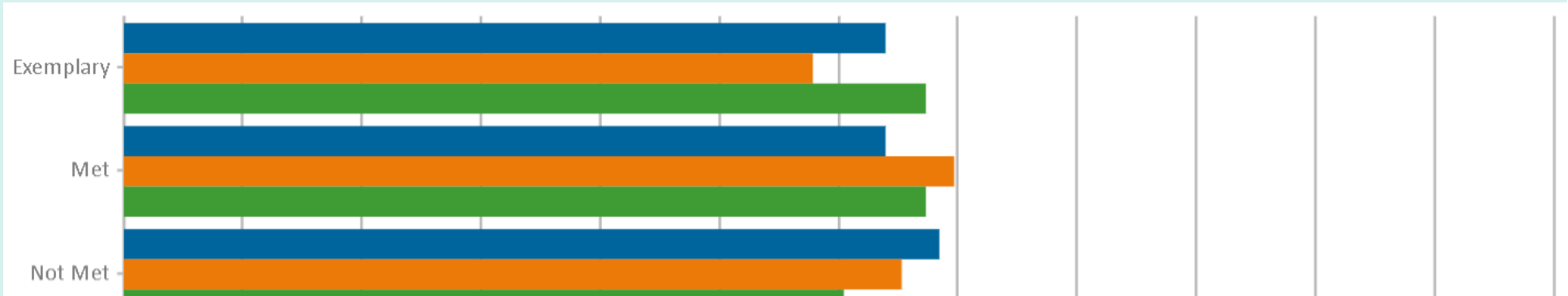

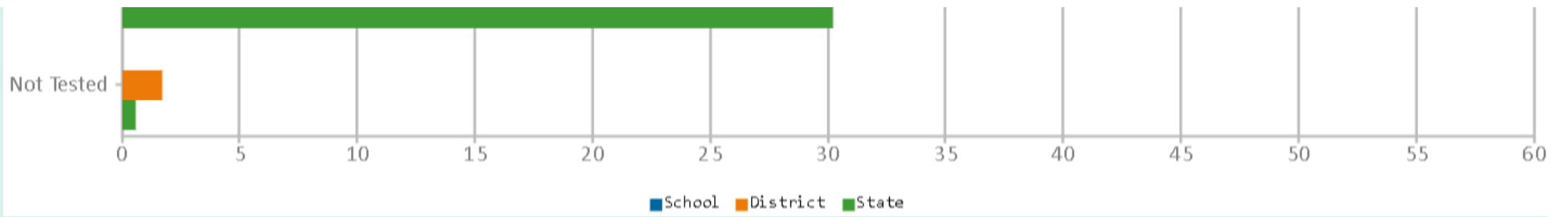

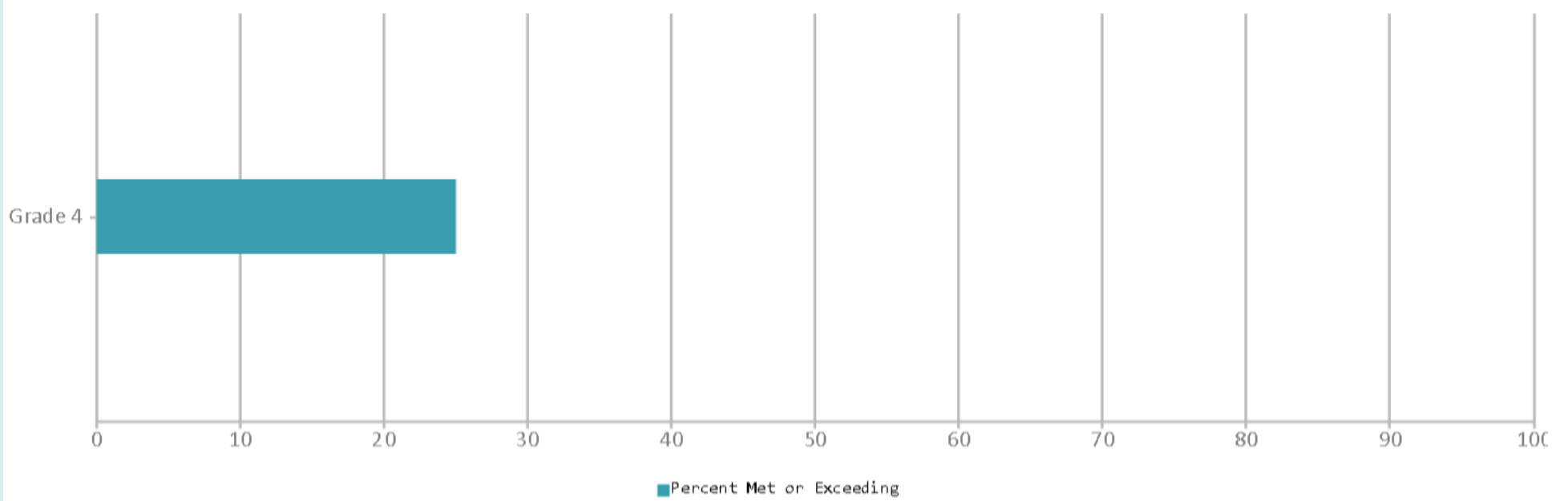

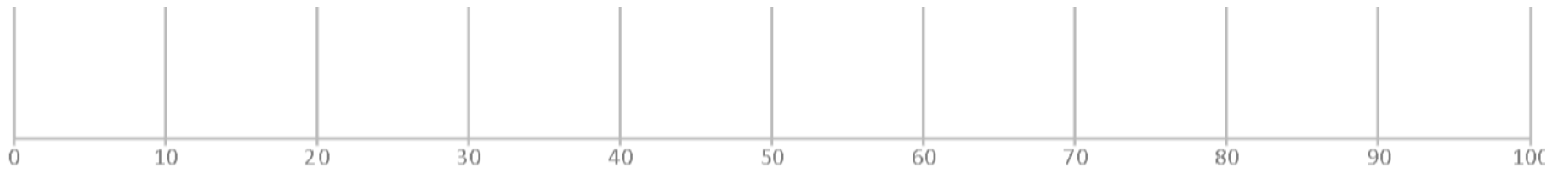

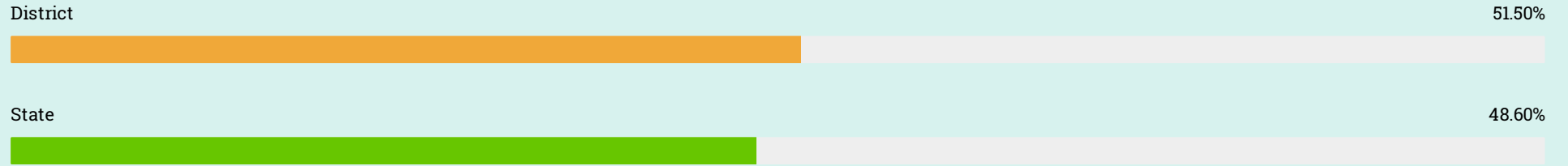

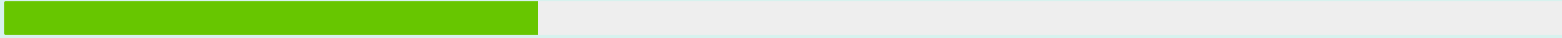
Percent of EL Students who met progress toward proficiency target

Overall Percentage of Progress Points Earned

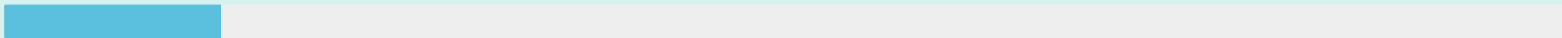

The South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) is in the final stages of working with district business officials to implement a reporting tool for per pupil expenditures at the school building level. The SCDE will report on per pupil expenditures by school building level on the 2019 School District report card.

[1] Section 1111(h)(1)(C)(x) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESSA) requires the reporting of: "The per-pupil expenditures of Federal, State, and local funds, including actual personnel expenditures and actual nonpersonnel expenditures of Federal, State, and local funds, disaggregated by source of funds, for each local educational agency and each school in the State for the preceding fiscal year"
